Letter from Daniel T. (Jewish American)

Subject: Urgent Action Needed: End the Gaza War and Protect Civilians

Dear [Elected Official's Name],

As a Jewish American, I am writing to express my deep concern about the escalating humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza.

As of September 2025, tens of thousands of innocent civilians — many of them children — have been killed, injured, or displaced. There are now over a thousand children amputees in Gaza as a result of Israeli bombs. Hospitals are collapsing, water and food are scarce, and entire neighborhoods have been reduced to rubble.

This is a human rights emergency.

And Israel continues to escalate, even though President Biden said as far back as May 2024 that Hamas is no longer a serious threat to Israel, and according to the Jewish Chronicle, “A group of former IDF chiefs of staff, Mossad directors, Shin Bet chiefs and Israel Police commissioners have signed a joint letter calling for an end to the ‘futile’ Gaza War and the return of the remaining hostages.” They added, “This is leading the State of Israel to the loss of its security and identity.”

More and more Jewish Americans are horrified at what the Israeli government is doing in Gaza, with increasingly little justification. As the New York Times has reported, “dozens of rabbis were arrested in demonstrations in New York and Washington last month, calling for more aid to Gaza and for Israel and its prime minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, to end the war.” And, “Perhaps most notably, the ranks of those raising concerns now also include a small group of Orthodox rabbis, whose communities have broadly not wavered in their staunch support of Israel throughout the war.” Those rabbis wrote, “We must affirm that Judaism's vision of justice and compassion extends to all human beings.”

Hundreds of thousands of Israelis themselves have been in the streets protesting their government's policies, calling for an end to the war and hostage negotiations — most prominently many families of the hostages who simply want their loved ones home. "Staunch support of Israel" could just as easily mean supporting these brave Israelis, and certainly the families of the hostages, whose government does not represent them in this matter.

Last but not least, Israel's actions in Gaza are making your Jewish constituents less safe. The U.S. has seen a surge in antisemitic activity since the war in Gaza started. And as Thomas Friedman has recently written, "Israel's Gaza Campaign Is Making It a Pariah State."

I urge you to:

1. Support and advocate for a permanent ceasefire, starting with an immediate withdrawal of all IDF troops from Gaza;
2. Work to ensure unrestricted humanitarian aid access to Gaza through all available channels;
3. Work to uphold international law and protect civilians, including aid workers and journalists;
4. Publicly call for accountability and peace negotiations grounded in justice.

Thank you for your attention to this urgent matter.

- A message of solidarity from your family, faith, or community

Adding your personal touch makes your letter more powerful.

 Subject Lines for Your Letters

Use strong, respectful subject lines like:

- "Support a Ceasefire in Gaza – Lives Depend on It"
- "As a Person of Faith, I Urge Compassionate Action"
- "Gaza Needs Aid – We Must Not Stay Silent"

 6. Amplify the Message

- Post your letter online and tag elected officials
- Use the hashtag #LettersForGaza
- Host a candlelight vigil, online prayer circle, or letter-writing gathering
