Sample Letter 1: Protect Health Care and the Common Good

Dear [Representative/Senator/Leader's Name],

Sample Letter 2: Protect Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid

Step 3: Send With Intention

Before sending, take a quiet moment to center yourself. You might hold your letter in your hands, breathe deeply, and say:

You can even place your hand over the envelope or email draft and envision it filled with Divine light. Small rituals like this help align action with higher purpose.
